GUAOA Orphanage Update

Health: Presently the children are in good health, none of them have Corona virus or Ebola.

Quarantine: The schools are presently closed due to Coronavirus as a result of guidance from the government. Some school leaders spend the day at work to receive tuition payments from parents for their children while they await the tentative re-opening of schools scheduled for May 18th. If schools do not open May 18th the next proposed date is June 2nd, unless informed otherwise.

Free K-6 Education: DRC's President; Felix Tchisekedi Tchilombo had announced free tuition in the DRC. This announcement was made when the school year was already in progress. This is applicable to public schools and only primary schools (not secondary schools), thus grades K-6. Although free education was announced, there are many hurdles the Government must first address: how will they pay the teachers, verification that teachers are certified and trained, and the process by which they will increase the number of public schools in the DRC - these efforts can take years.

GUAOA Vocational Program Updates

Sewing Program

GUAOA started off 2019 with 3 sewing machines, but in February 2019, one of those machines were no longer operable; we were grateful to receive a \$250 donation to replace it. Last year, 15 orphans opted to enroll in the program. Thanks to the training they received, they were able to solicit clients and render their services. They made a total of \$700 in 2019 which helped them cover program costs, pay for a conference room to work out of whenever the room was not donated, and most importantly it helped cover the 15 children's day-to-day needs and contribute towards the purchase of food. We hope to raise additional funds to expand this program by purchasing additional machines which will allow people in the community to take classes from skilled GUAOA children where they can charge a small fee in addition to making funds from sewing. This will ensure our mission of empowering them to become self-sufficient is realized.

SUCCESS STORY

One of our Sewing Program success stories is **Aline**. Aline graduated High School in 2015 thanks to a Sponsor in Goma. She completed our Vocational Training Sewing program in 2018. She now teaches other orphans to sew and has clients of her own which helps her make a living. Aline recently got married in 2019!

Computer Training Program

This program is being run with 5 computers, and a printer where the orphans learn how to use Microsoft office and the internet. In 2019, 10 children enrolled and completed the program. With this program, our goal is to raise funds to purchase additional computers, another printer and a scanner to not only train more orphans but also create an opportunity where children that have completed the program, can charge those in the community who want to learn and some of the computers can be used for a Cyber Café. This Cyber Café will help people in the community who do not own a computer (the majority of the population), to pay for the use of the computer and printing services (similar to a FedEx Office Center). Funds they make will allow them to cover their operating costs and livelihood provisions.

Agricultural Program

Thanks to an anonymous Donor, we were able to purchase a small plot of land in 2019 where GUAOA has been able to grow vegetables. In 2019, 11 children enrolled in the program and were able to harvest twice that year. During their first harvest, they were able to provide a meal for 66 orphans and during the 2nd harvest they were able to feed 77 children. With this program, we hope to raise funds to purchase an additional plot of land in order to increase production. Our goal with this program is for GUAOA to grow enough food to feed all the orphans and have the ability to sell any surplus to cover this program's expenses.

When it was announced that NY state was putting into place a stay at home order, we had no choice but to cancel 2 of our scheduled fundraiser events. We reached out to you, seeking assistance from those that were able. As a result, we raised \$875, for that we Thank You Very Much!! \$875 may seem like a little to some but it is a huge deal to the children of GUAOA! This is how your contributions have helped them:





Room rented for 6 months where GUAOA can conduct the computer training and sewing programs. This gives them space to run the programs 5 days a week on a consistent basis as opposed to when a business is willing to let them use a conference room sporadically.





Getting more than one meal a day continues to be a struggle for GUAOA due to limited funds but thanks to your donations, beans, peas, potatoes, corn and oil have been purchased which will sustain the children for approximately 11 days:
