VOLCANO ERUPTION CRISIS RELIEF EFFORTS RESULTS

We are extremely grateful to everyone that generously donated towards the volcano relief efforts! The following is a summary of how your donations were put to great use!

NOURISHMENT FOR GUAOA ORPHANAGE AND STREET CHILDREN

The first installment of funds were sent on Saturday, May 29th to the orphanage for nutritional needs. From there we sent funds weekly throughout the month of June to purchase and prepare warm meals for the children which they received twice a day. Given that so many Goma residents were without food and water at the height of the crisis, the children from the orphanage were sharing their meals with street children in the neighborhood. Over 100 children were fed weekly during the month of June!









VOLCANO ERUPTION CRISIS RELIEF EFFORTS CONTINUED

STOLEN ITEMS REPLACED

Thanks to your donations, we have replaced items that were stolen from the orphanage which included mattresses, blankets, sheets, plates, cups, spoons and bowls. The funds also covered the cost for security to ensure the children are safe.

REPORT CARDS UPDATE


